## IPA POLAND 13TH CONGRESS IN WARSAW



Between the 8th and 9th of December, the 13th Congress of Delegates of IPA Polish Section, gathering the delegates of all the voivodship groups, took place in “Arche Krakowska” hotel in Warsaw. We were honored by the presence of the International President – Mr. Martin Hoffmann and 17 national delegations from: Austria, Albania, Montenegro, Czech Republic, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Greece, Ireland, Lithuania, Germany, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, Ukraine and UK.

The congress began with the introduction of the IPA Polish Section banner and Polish and IPA anthems. The first day was marked by the submission of reports by the Presidium and the Audit Committee, which were accepted by the delegates, as well as the discharge of the outgoing members of the Presidium for the 4-year term. The election of a new President, Presidium and Audit Committee then proceeded.

## IPA POLAND 13TH CONGRESS IN WARSAW

In the evening, a gala ceremony was held, during which medals and awards were presented to IPA members, as well as to people of merit to the association. Particularly honored, awarding the honorary title of "Man of the Year of the IPA Polish Section" was Mr. Superintendent Tomasz Trawinski - Commander of the voivodship Police Department in Szczecin. The title was awarded in gratitude for his outstanding contributions, kindness and projects undertaken in cooperation with IPA, which have served the police as well as the community.

During the ceremony, a letter of gratitude and an officer's saber were presented to one of the oldest members of the IPA – our colleague Piotr Szymurski, who served multiple terms as Chairman of the Audit Committee. Thank you Piotr! We sincerely hope that you will still offer us your wisdom and advice.

At the request of the Medals Chapter, the National Board granted medals and awards, which were presented at this gala by the President Piotr Wójcik, as follows:



- “Meritorious for IPA Polish Section” medal was granted to our colleague Adnrzej Wakulewski
  - “IPA Polish Section Cross of Merit” was granted to our colleagues Krzysztof Rozpędowski and Tadeusz Chołodecki
  - Golden medal "For outstanding statutory activities" was granted to Piotr Szymurski and Wiesław Rzyduch
  - Silver medal "For outstanding statutory activities" was granted to Sylwia Król and Robert Olszewski
- Commemorative gifts were also exchanged with foreign delegations.

The delegates began the second day with a discussion on amendments to the Statute, which were presented by the Statute Committee, which had been established earlier by the National Board for this purpose. The amendments drafted on behalf of the committee were presented by its chairwoman, colleague Elzbieta Gargula, who firstly presented proposed amendments to the Statute within the framework of a resolution of the National Board (concerning the establishment of an Honorary Court within the association, changes in the functioning of the Audit Committee, setting the deadline for paying the fee at June 30 each year, and defining the authority for the National Board to raise the fee). These proposals were not approved by the delegates. The chairwoman then presented the Statute Committee's own proposals, which included alterations to rearrange some of the provisions of the existing Statute, most of these amendments were accepted by the delegates and will be reflected in the Statute of the IPA Polish Section.

After the lunch break, the delegates attended the International Conference on "Road Safety". After the conference, the banner of the IPA Polish Section was carried out, and the President of the Polish Section, Piotr Wójcik, uttered the formula "I hereby close the 13<sup>th</sup> Congress of Delegates of the IPA Polish Section."

## IPA UK - GERMAN EXCHANGE



In October 2023 DC Lauren Eifert, PC Marcus Zost and Sgt James Wingate from Hertfordshire travelled to Germany as part of an exchange programme between Hertfordshire Constabulary and Siegburg Police near Bonn.

“Upon arriving in Cologne, we were met by our extremely welcoming host, Mike, who drove us to the Siegburg Police HQ where we were welcomed by the Commissioner, Andreas Piastowski. Andreas was so down to earth and approached us as friends right from the start rather than a senior officer. Andreas had planned a packed programme for us and access all

areas and already showed us why the IPA’s motto is “service through friendship”.

The first day consisted of meeting our hosts, touring the Siegburg Police HQ and the various units based here. It was clear from the outset that there were real similarities between our work and demands, particularly hearing about CID’s huge workloads! A close inspection of the response team’s vehicle was much the same as any of our patrol vehicles, apart from the addition of an MP5 submachine gun! Not something you see every day and we were all fascinated by it, especially as it sat next to a few cones.

Other visits included the traffic department, custody, where there were no permanent staff and arresting officers process their own prisoners, and the control room. An innovative idea was a crime prevention room where community members could visit and see recommended doors, cameras and locks for themselves as well as practical preventative steps which was really relevant to our own force priorities of “Prevention First”.

On the second day we joined two response officers on a community safety day. Multiple units came together such as dog units, drug units, ASB units, and general patrol units. They all have specific roles in their communities to drive down crime and keep people safe including from plain clothed officers in drug hotspots, ASB officers in hotspots and general patrol officers stopping drink / drug drivers to prevent harm on the road networks. During this operation we were crewed with two proactive and friendly officers and had the task of preventing criminals using the road network and motorists committing traffic offences. We moved throughout the district to keep the criminals and road users guessing where we would be next. The rain made it more difficult to carry out the operation, but this did not dampen our spirits. We watched as our German counterparts engaged with the community and processed offences. This initiative clearly worked, and we were keen to bring this home with us to use locally in our force areas.

On the final day we visited the range and fired the standard issue Glock pistol used by officers on patrol under the watchful eye of our enthusiastic instructors. The addition of interactive moving targets and scenarios brought some realism to the range as we “attended” domestics and building searches and had to decide when to fire our weapons. It was an eye-opening experience as to the added responsibility of carrying a firearm on patrol and the split-second decisions required.

The afternoon saw us taken to the Bonn Police Riot unit by the Commissioner. We saw officers completing training in unarmed tactics, pistol and MP5 drills. The unit also has a counter-terrorism role, and it was obvious throughout their demonstrations how seriously they took their training and how professional they all were. PC Zost was volunteered by the others to demonstrate some of our unarmed tactics. None of the officers wanted to be the test subject, which we do not blame them, so the Commissioner took up the mantle and let us say that what happens in Germany stays in Germany! (Nobody was hurt in the making of this article). The Riot police officers showed us some technical vehicles they had access to that was a fully installed mobile CCTV vehicle to monitor and record anyone in large protests or crowds which was not something we had seen in the UK.



No trip can be complete without sightseeing, and we managed to visit Cologne! We saw the Rhine River



headed into the hills to visit the grounds of Steinberger Grand Hotel Petersberg where Queen Elizabeth II stayed during a trip to Bonn many years ago. The view was spectacular extended as far as the eye could see. We then headed to the world-famous Cologne Cathedral.

One of the real highlights of our trip was staying with our German host. Mike, an experienced serving officer, welcomed us into his family home and his wife and daughters were so hospitable. It was an experience that just wouldn't be available to any other visitor and was a true example of the IPA's ability to connect officers all over the world and create friendships.

We were also welcomed so wonderfully by the Commissioner who moved mountains to ensure we had an engaging, sociable, and overwhelmingly positive experience. We made so many contacts and friendships which really demonstrated the amazing objectives of the IPA.

Every officer we encountered was friendly, professional, and positive and there was such a family feel to the force, despite the demands they faced. They were a credit to the Policing family! We would absolutely recommend joining the IPA to any colleague – these opportunities are out there and all you need to do is grab them with both hands!”

# IPA IRELAND - MY JOURNEY TO THE 66TH WORLD CONGRESS IN ATHENS



Let me introduce myself before we begin my IPA journey through Western Europe and down through the Balkan states to Athens in Greece.

My name is Damian Crummey and I am a long-time member of IPA Section Ireland. I have been the National treasurer for Section Ireland for the past 8 years and I am retired having served 30 years with the Irish police force (An Garda Siochana).

In 2023 I had the opportunity to attend the 66<sup>th</sup> World congress in Athens in late October and also as a member of the International relations committee, I was due to chair my first seminar in Gimborn castle (The use of drones in front line services) in early October. Living in the most Westerly part of Europe it is quite a journey to Athens, however I saw an opportunity to combine my love of motorbikes and of meeting colleagues through the IPA.

I decided to make contact with each and every IPA section I was due to visit on my journey asking only to meet some colleagues for a coffee or a beer as I passed through their countries. We were very well looked after and we visited some interesting sites near their home. Later we rode on to Antwerp where we stayed in the IPA apartment. I would highly recommend this apartment which has 2 double bedrooms and is situated above the IPA office and is very centrally located.

The following day we moved on to Germany and my friend took the opportunity to visit Cologne for a few days while I arrived in Gimborn for the Drone conference. As it was my first time to chair a seminar in Gimborn I was very much looking forward to the week ahead. There were 29 attendees from 9 countries and it was a great success – so much so that Gimborn have scheduled the seminar again for 2024 (30 September - 4 October) so please pass on the good news.

Having left Gimborn we now rode south and arrived in Vienna Austria a few days later where we met Andreas Nesser (a friend and colleague on the International relations commission) and Section Austria President Martin Hoffmann for a lovely evening in the city.

Maribor in Slovenia was our next port of call and we were met by Dejan Lenarcic who met us for a beer and also arranged accommodation and breakfast in the local police training facility for us. We continued South along the Danube crossing into Serbia for breakfast, then back into Croatia where we met Vesna Znidaric Bolaric in Osijek for lunch and later that evening we crossed into Bosnia for dinner ! Gradacac was our stop for the night and we were treated to dinner and a stay in the castle which has much great history. I have local IPA member Jasmin Hecimovic to thank for meeting with us and arranging our stay.

# IPA USA & W.A.D. VANCOUVER BRITISH COLUMBIA TRIP



After my amazing three week trip to Prague and Eastern Europe in April and May of this year, my wanderlust kicked in once again and my travels took me to Vancouver British Columbia in October 2023. I was attending the World Association of Detectives (W.A.D.) 98<sup>th</sup> annual conference at the Fairmont Waterfront hotel where I was voted in as Board Director. I contacted my IPA USA 2<sup>nd</sup> VP liaison Carmen Alvelo who once again assisted me with my endeavors. Carmen put me in touch with William Powell IPA USA Region 5 who subsequently reached out to Karen Frost IPA Vancouver Region 9 VP and Bill Ardill IPA Vancouver Region 13 Travel Secretary.

Once again I explained the W.A.D. and IPA Memorandum of Understanding for those who were not aware. W.A.D. was founded in 1925 and currently contains over 1,000 professional investigative members in 84 countries. W.A.D. past president and chairman Dan Rusu, a member of IPA Romania and past IPA President Pierre-Martin Moulin collaboratively signed this MOU in 2019. The main purposes of the MOU are enhancing and sharing knowledge, training, networking, camaraderie and joint membership between both organisations, including retired police officers who are eligible to join W.A.D. One thing I learned after retirement is that private detectives and investigators can play a vital role



in assisting our public sector officers as some of the work goes hand in hand.

I met up with retired Police Officer Karen Frost who became not only my tour guide throughout Vancouver but my friend. Karen mentioned to me that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police had suffered a tragic loss of Constable Rick O'Brien on Friday September 22 as the ninth police officer killed in the line of duty so far, with two more Mounties injured during that fatal day. It was due to these horrendous circumstances than many other members could not join us or attend our W.A.D. festivities due to preparation for the funeral services on October 4<sup>th</sup> further outside of Vancouver. Also the manpower of IPA Region 9 is suffering due to retirement and active duty members working very long hours.

Karen and I journeyed across Vancouver through Stanley Park and onto Grouse Mountain for some sightseeing whilst enjoying the unexpectedly beautiful weather. After taking the skyride lift way up the 4,000 foot (1200 meter) peak, we saw a highly entertaining Lumberjack show and visited with the resident bears. Afterwards, we returned to downtown Vancouver and visited the Vancouver Police Department (VPD) on Cambie Street. Although Karen said the previous experience in bringing an IPA member to the police department was not successful, this particular visit proved fruitful. Not only did we take photos and exchange patches with the officers outside, we were able to take a tour inside due in part to our new friend Patty. Karen said later on that I was her lucky charm in making a new friend for future IPA visitors to gain access to a tour of VPD.

After our police tour, we went to eat at Craft Beer Market False Creek. Since my gracious host extended the courtesy of providing me with a fantastic tour of Vancouver, dinner was my treat.

A few days later, I met up with Karen once again with some other IPA and W.A.D. members for a planned dinner at Tap & Barrel by the Vancouver Waterfront Convention Centre. Karen met me at the Lion's Pub for happy hour with some W.A.D. colleagues. Afterwards, we headed to dinner and were joined by my W.A.D. colleagues who are also IPA members: Alex Auslander from Israel, my former NYPD detective partner from NYC Juan Leonbravo, and newest IPA Chicago member Detective Michael Basile. IPA Vancouver Region 9 members who joined us besides Karen were RCMP Constable Alex Zaganas and retired Police Officer Jan Fikkert.



We exchanged patches and stories of our different police departments and how policing can work together across nations. Some members joined us on a pub crawl after dinner down the waterfront to Mahony's Tavern to meet with other W.A.D. members. In the end, we came to the realization that policies in policing are quite different based on geographical location as well as cultural diversity, but we can all learn from one another as we all bleed blue.

There was joy and jubilation as the children welcomed the IPA Section Kenya delegation to their premises. The IPA Section Kenya had, in partnership with the Shree Cutchi Gujarati Hindu Union (C.G.H.U) donated foodstuffs (bales of flour, beans, green grams) and clothing items including blazers, sportswear and school uniforms. The centre is home to 80 children and young adults of various ages ranging from primary school age to college students. The Centre caters for children rescued from the city streets of Nairobi.

The IPA delegation, led by the National Secretary General, Mr. Jared Ojuok, HSC, the Deputy National Treasurer Mr. Arcard Kisingo and IPA Nairobi Region Member, Mr. Lawrence Mukolwe, HSC, met the C.G.H.U Shiv Temple leadership of Chairman, Mr. M. Patel, Hon. Secretary, Mr. L. Velani, and Committee Members Mr. Jitu Wadia, Mr. Satyan Shah, the Coordinator. Also present was Dr. Shaina Shah, who meticulously planned for, and coordinated collection.

All the while, the boys who had been informed of our intended visit waited in anticipation. As soon as the first vehicle loaded with foodstuff approached the gate to the Centre, there were shouts of joy, welcoming the IPA guests. Led by the Centre Manager, Mr. David Arika, the boys received the items and straightaway went to change into their new attire. Now smartly dressed in blazers and new trousers, they burst into song and dance, singing Christmas carols and Christian worship songs.

While addressing the gathering, IPA Kenya Secretary-General, Mr. Jared Ojuok, HSC informed the boys that the International Police Association exists to propagate true friendship and unconditional love for fellow humans.

Finally, the IPA Section Kenya handed over to the management of the Children's Centre the foodstuffs and clothing valued at USD 2,000.

Based at the Police Treatment Centre (PTC), St. Andrews, those attending were provided with comfortable accommodation, fantastic food, superb service and a couple of great walks around Harrogate on Saturday and Temple Newsam near Leeds on Sunday.

For many, the weekend provided a practical introduction to the British Walking Federation and its parent organisation, the International Federation of Popular Sports (IVV).

To complement the practical experience, after our tasty evening meal on Friday, IPA members Spike and Helen Elliott from Cheshire Branch, who are also both long standing members of the BWF, and have together walked an incredible 65,000Km, all of which has been accredited under the IVV Awards Scheme, gave a presentation about the Section UK IPA Walking Group, BWF, IVV, International Marching League (IML) and their travels and experiences participating in walking events and walking Permanent Trails around the globe.

Harrogate became known as 'The English Spa' in the Georgian period and was popularised through a boom in Spa tourism during the Victorian era. During the 1800s, the high society of Victorian Britain flocked to Harrogate to enjoy the air, the space and the therapeutic spa treatments as well as taking the famous Harrogate waters. The town's most distinctive feature perhaps is its vast open space, known as The Stray, that surrounds the town centre. At 200 acres, The Stray gives Harrogate a green and spacious feel that is unique to the town.

With plenty of Georgian and Victorian architecture, the town still maintains an elegant and opulent feel and is home to the renowned Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) Harlow Carr Gardens. The acclaimed Betty's Café Tea Rooms can also be found in the town centre.

Following a hearty breakfast and a group photo on the steps of the PTC, the merry band of walkers set out on a grey and misty morning to follow an 11Km trail around Harrogate taking in the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) Gardens, the magnificent Stray and many other points of historical and cultural interest in the town. Beyond its illustrious Tudor origins, the Ingram family also left their marks. Today Temple Newsam contains a rich tapestry of period interiors from the 1600s onwards, showing how different generations lived.

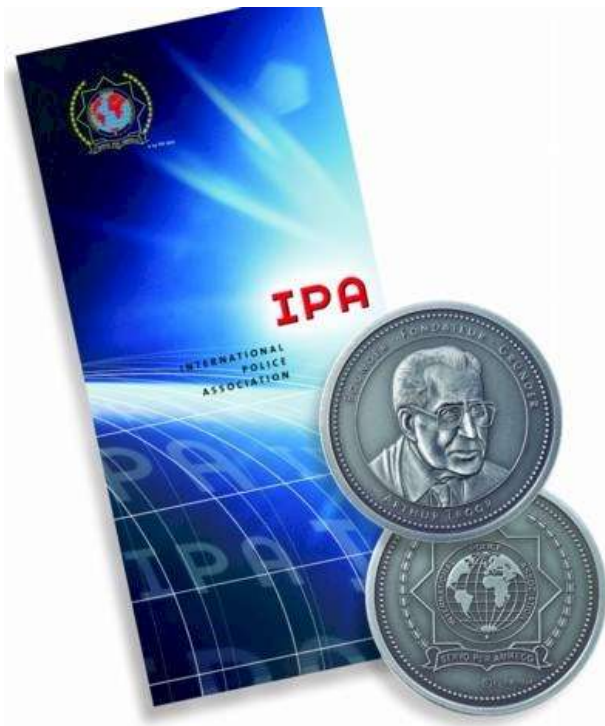
## ANNUAL BLACK TIE GALA DINNER
